...the errors of John's day were really an accommodation of Christian faith to the prevailing ideas of the secular culture. In ever generation the church is challenged by the world, either to confront or to absorb its culture, to 'be squeezed into its mould', or to 'let God re-mould your minds from within'. Today we are in danger of reflecting the existentialist philosophy of our society and not challenging it. That is why we Christians so often base our judgment and conduct on our personal feelings and experiences rather than on God's revealed truth.
